MAJOR AUTUMN SHOW ON THE ARTISTIC FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN MATISSE AND BONNARD

MATISSE – BONNARD. "LONG LIVE PAINTING!" 13 SEPTEMBER 2017 TO 14 JANUARY 2018 Städel Museum, Exhibition House

Frankfurt am Main, 7 June 2017. The Städel Museum is currently preparing a major special exhibition: From 13 September, the Frankfurt museum will be presenting two outstanding artists – Henri Matisse (1869–1954) and Pierre Bonnard (1867–1947) – in an exhibition that is the first in Germany to bring these key modern masters together. At the heart of the comprehensive presentation is the friendship between the two French artists which lasted for over forty years. Both painters shared a preference for the same range of subjects: interiors, still lifes, landscapes and the female nude. With a selection of more than a hundred paintings, sculptures, drawings and prints, the exhibition opens a dialogue between Matisse and Bonnard and offers new perspectives on the development of the European avant-garde from the beginning of the twentieth century to the end of the Second World War.

After the successful conclusion of the extensive loan negotiations, the Städel is looking forward to presenting outstanding works from internationally renowned collections, among them the Art Institute of Chicago, the Tate Modern in London, the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Centre Pompidou and the Musée d'Orsay in Paris, the State Hermitage in Saint Petersburg and the National Gallery of Art in Washington. The selection of works is complemented by a substantial group of photographs by Henri Cartier-Bresson who visited the artists on the French Riviera in 1944. A particular highlight of the exhibition are the two paintings the artists owned by one another, which will be shown together for the first time. Another highlight is Matisse's *Large Reclining Nude* of 1935 – a key work which has not been on display in Germany for more than thirty years and which will be on loan from the Baltimore Museum of Art.

"French art has a long tradition at the Städel Museum. Henri Matisse and Pierre Bonnard – both of whom are represented in our collection – had long and successful careers and enjoyed recognition far beyond the borders of their native France. Our autumn exhibition is the first to allow the German public to experience the two artist friends in a fascinating dialogue and to discover Bonnard, who is less well-known in Germany, through a sizable number of his most important works," the Städel's director, Philipp Demandt, explains.

The title of the exhibition, "Long Live Painting!" is based on the programmatic exclamation with which Matisse saluted his friend Bonnard on 13 August 1925. Those three words on a postcard from Amsterdam were the beginning of a correspondence that went on for more than twenty years and that testifies to the depth of the respect and appreciation the two artists felt for each other. In the first decade of the twentieth century, both painters left Paris, then the capital of the avant-garde, for the Côte d'Azur, where they continued to cement their reputation as leading lights of the European art scene. Despite the near-contiguity of their lives and careers, art historians tend to correlate them with two opposing trends: Bonnard's breezy, loose brushwork and scintillating soft pastels give rise to the construct of the painter as the last great heir of Impressionism, while Matisse's preference for strong colours and flat, heavily contoured compositions earn him the accolade of being named a pioneer of twentieth-century abstraction. The juxtaposition of the two friends and colleagues questions this long-established view of their respective oeuvres and sheds new light on their distinct contributions to the development of modern painting.
